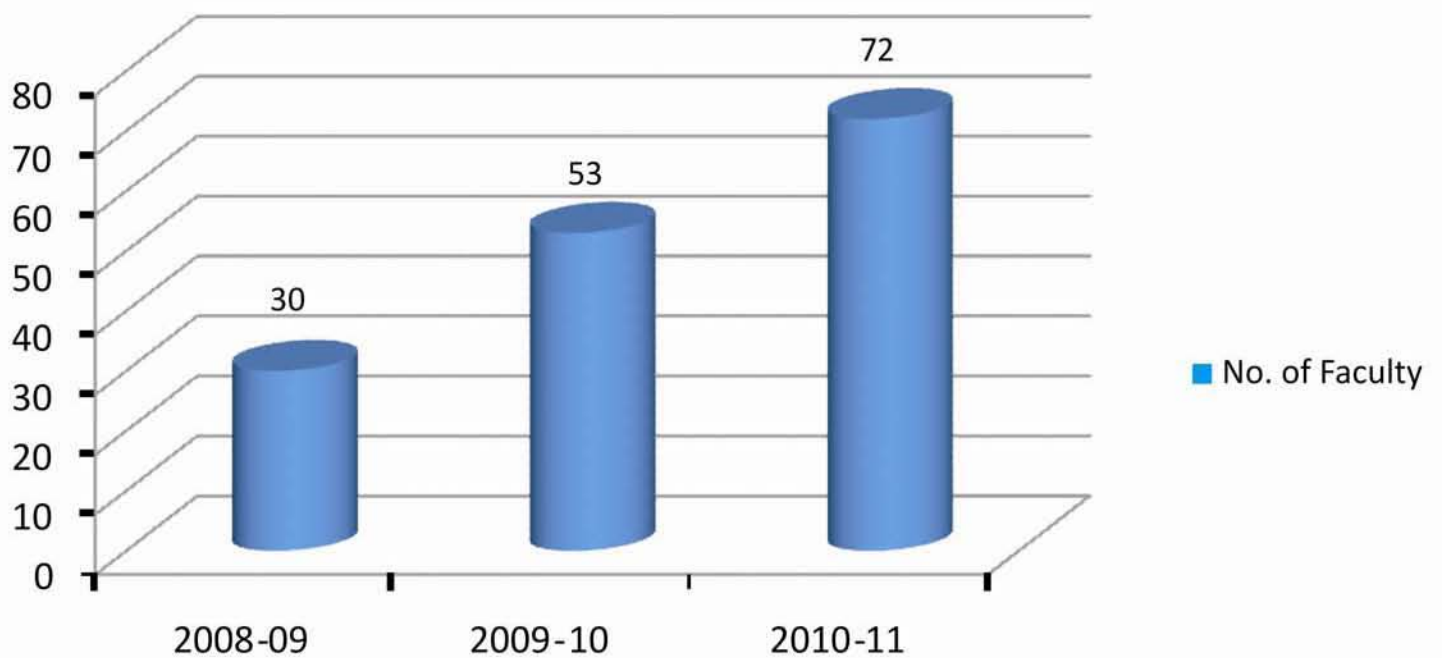
We at SIBA believe that the continuum of learning is a life-long and far-stretched. Therefore, there is no problem in handling it through deep study and research.

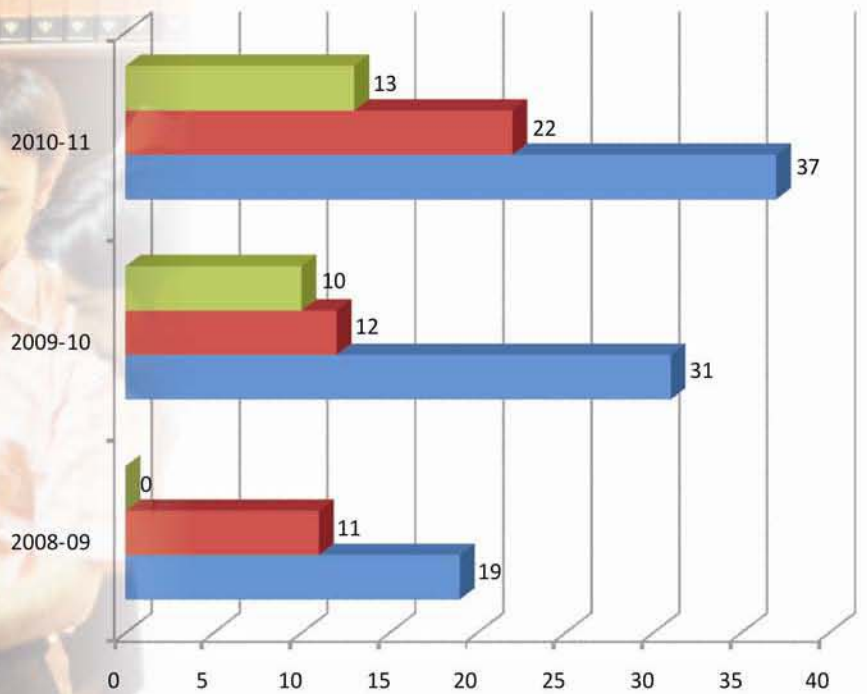


REGULAR FACULTY STRENGTH



DEPARTMENT WISE FACULTY

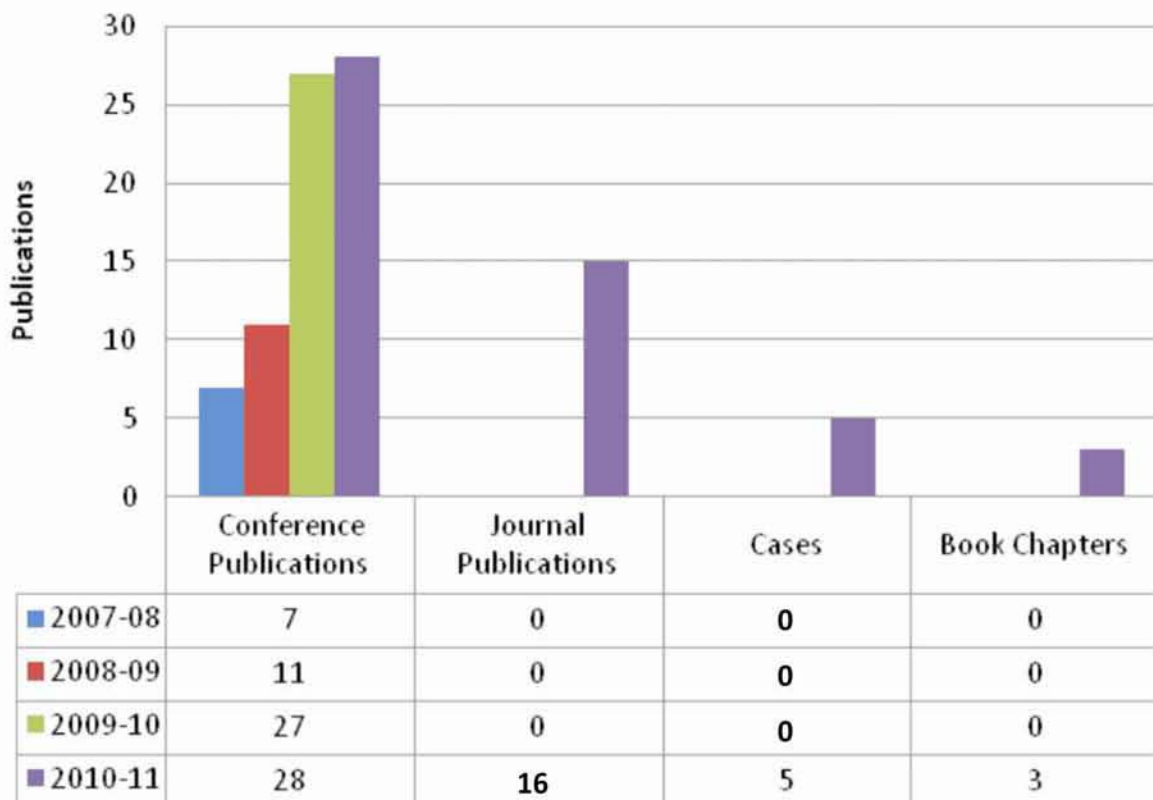

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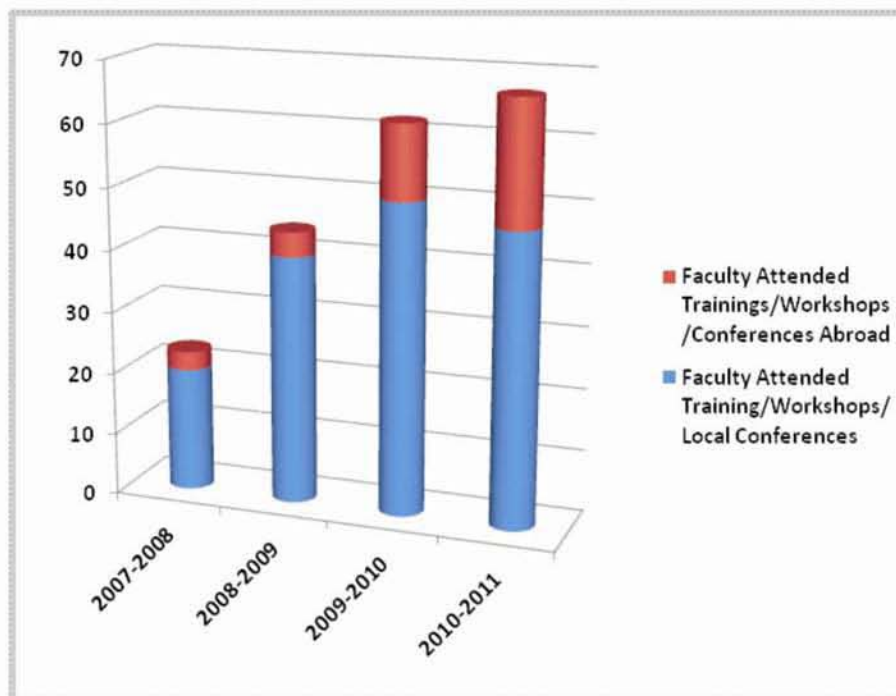




FACULTY DEVELOPMENT AT SUKKUR IBA

CASE-BASED TEACHING

In this global village, new pedagogical methods are being introduced to increase the productivity in teaching and learning. Case-based teaching is the most welcome trend, followed in universities all around the world. These students suffer from poverty² (Poverty x Poverty). They are not only financially poor but academically poor, having received poor education in primary as well as secondary levels. The funds allocated for the year 2010-2011 were 142.96 million. The amount released was only 57.184 million out of which 56.48 million had been utilized up to 30th April this Year.

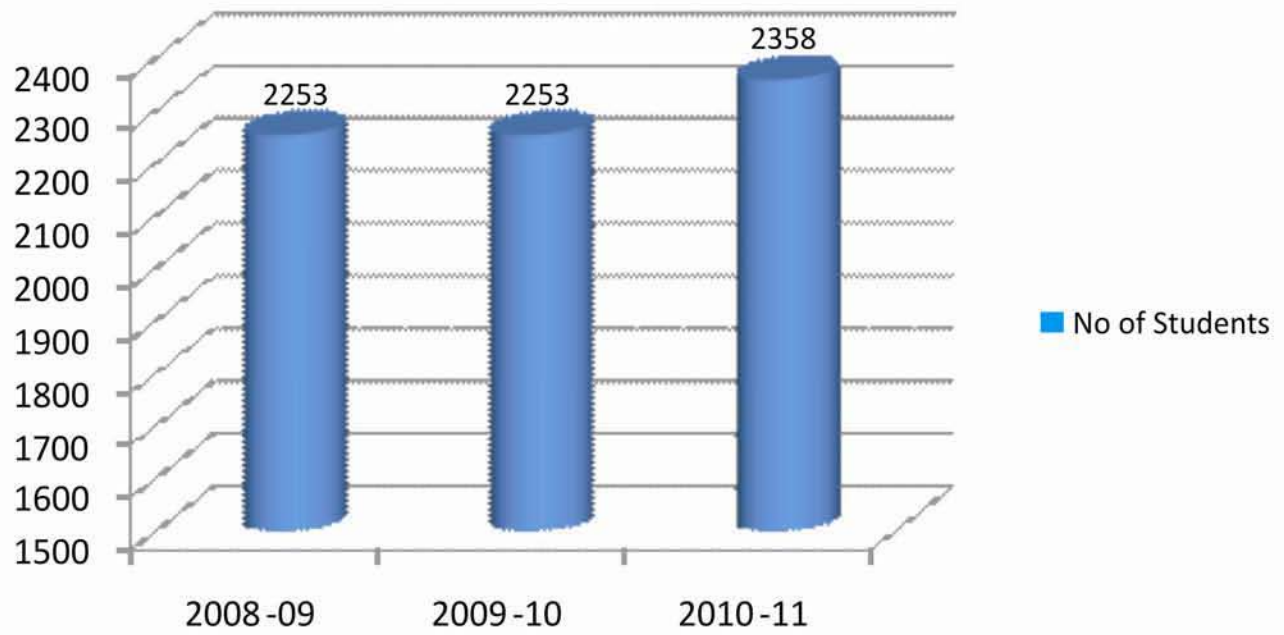

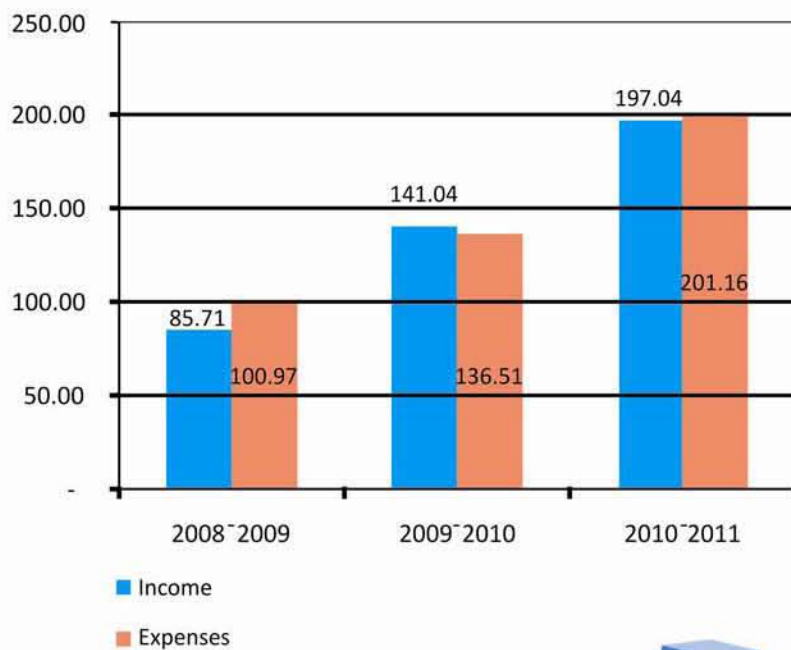

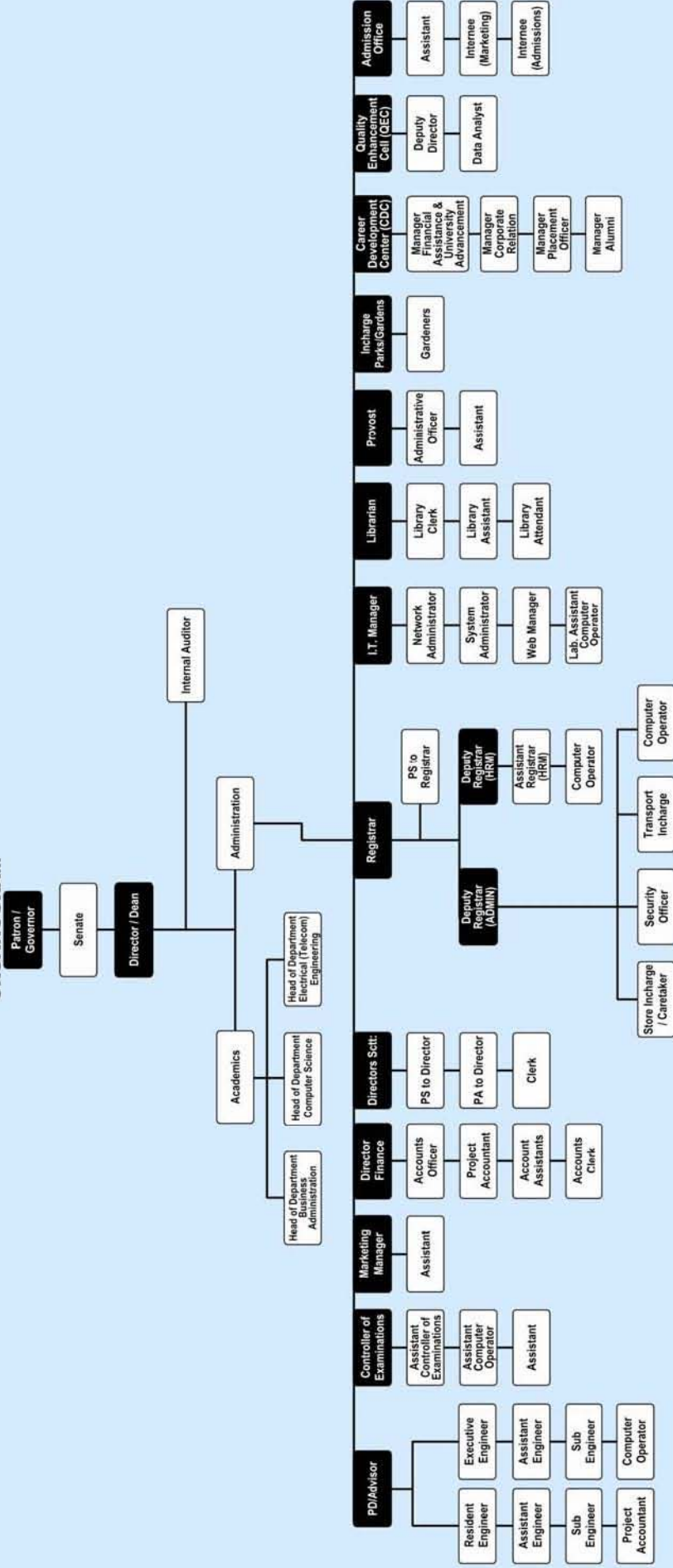


EVENING WITH FLOWERS AT SUKKUR IBA
