Executive Summary

Sukkur IBA an innovative institute of Pakistan- started its journey from as an independent degree awarding institute from year 2006. Within a decade, the institute grew by leaps and bounds as a center of excellence in the disciplines of Management, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics. The Higher Education Commission (HEC), Government of Pakistan has ranked Sukkur IBA among top business schools of Pakistan. The institute is also striving hard to raise its education standard through international accreditations and linkages. Sukkur IBA has taken several innovative initiatives including establishment of Bloomberg Financial Trading Lab, Establishment of FabLab in collaboration with MIT, USA and converting institute to sustainable energy option through a phenomenal solar project. Sukkur IBA's Finance and Human Resource Management processes are also fully automated through implementation of Enterprise Resource Planning (ERP).

Community Services are at the heart of the institute's mission with focus on uplifting the standard of education in rural Pakistan. To bridge the rural-urban gap, institute has pioneered two important interventions, one short term and other long term. Talent Hunt Program is a short term intervention. Given the miserable condition of our education system, most of our students are not ready to enter higher education after completing their 12th grade education. Sukkur IBA introduced Talent Hunt Program (THP) in the year 2007, in which students are trained to eliminate their academic deficiencies in the areas of English, Mathematics and ICT. Establishment of Community Colleges is a long-term intervention. These colleges aim at producing middle level skilled and semi-skilled professionals who can join industry and ultimately contribute to the economic development of Pakistan. Currently, Sukkur IBA is operating six community colleges in the districts of Khairpur, Dadu, Jacobabad, Naushahro Feroze, Sukkur and Ghotki.



To ensure quality intervention in the academic and administrative aspects, Sukkur IBA put great emphasis on quality assurance and faculty development. Institute established Quality Enhancement Cell (QEC) which works closely with the Office of International Accreditations. These offices are responsible for enhancing academic quality and achieving Sukkur IBA's long term goal of acquiring international accreditations, including AACSB, EFMD, AMBA and ABET. To improve teaching quality, Sukkur IBA strongly believes in capacity building of its faculty and staff. For the long term benefits, institute has heavily invested in faculty development through sponsoring their Masters and PhD degrees abroad. More than 90 faculty/staff members have already benefited from this program.

As a solution provider to the industry, the institute maintains strong academia-industry linkages. Launching BBA Agribusiness Program in collaboration with University of Agriculture Faisalabad (UAF) is one such initiative. Under this program, a joint batch of fifty (50 each) students is selected by both institutions who spend two years each at both universities. Sukkur IBA is also offering a four-year degree program in BS Accounting & Finance. The degree holders of this program use this degree as a terminal degree and join the workforce. Alternatively, they might choose to go for professional Charter Accountancy (CA) degree where they are offered a waiver in modules. Institute is also engaged rigorously with industries for the job placements, internship, MBA Projects, campus drive, job fair and fund-raising.

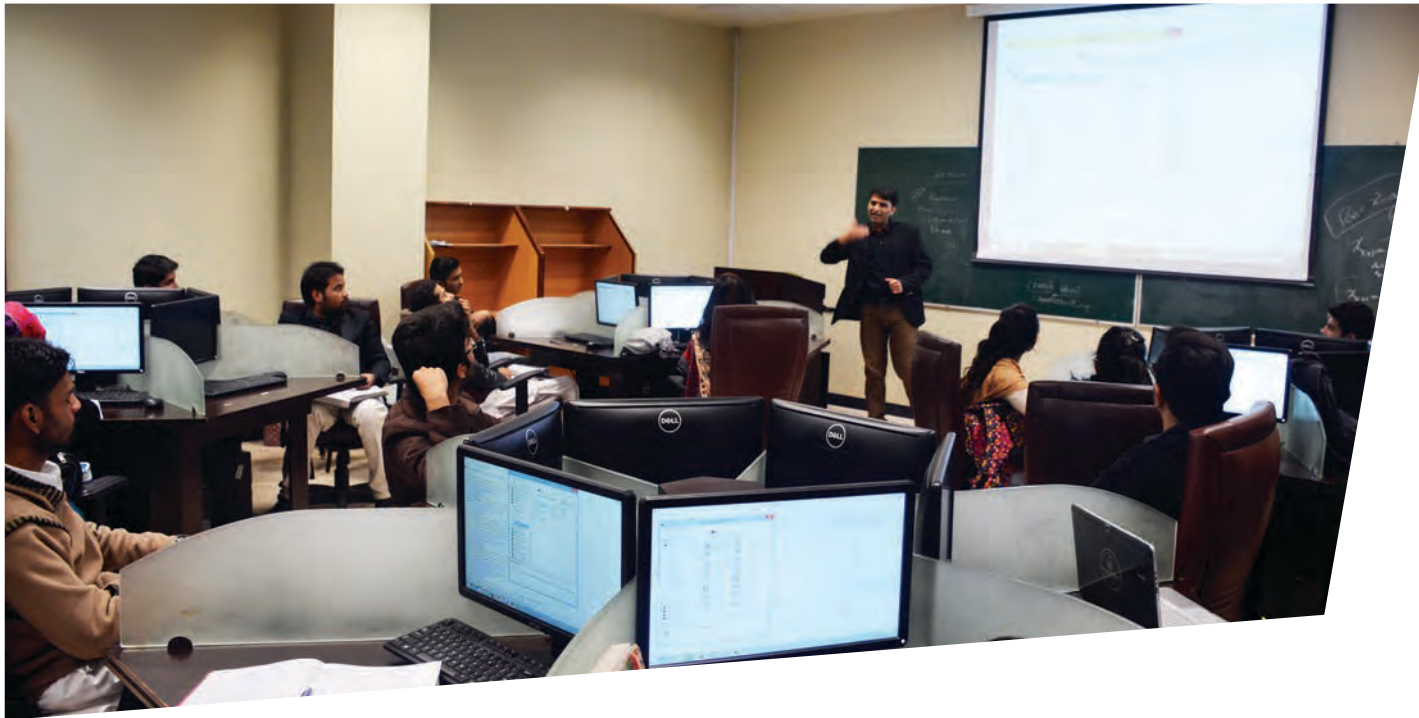

Graduate Programs

MS-Applied Mathematics

The MS program in Applied Mathematics prepares students for careers in research, applications, and

teaching. Students choose courses from three areas of concentration for their course work: Applied Mathematics, Computations Mathematics and Math Finance. Students are required to successfully qualify eight courses (6 compulsory and 2 electives) each of 3 credit hours duration. On successful completion of MS course work, students will be allowed to work on a 06 credit hour thesis on a subject of interest and on the availability of the faculty. The MS Program takes usually 2 to 2.5 years to complete and students must pass GRE/NTS exam prior to the completion of the degree according to HEC criteria.

Office of Research Innovation and Commercialization (ORIC) Overview

Realizing the importance of research in academic excellence and providing solutions to social problems, Sukkur Institute of Business Administration established the office of Research, Innovation, and Commercialization (ORIC) in September 2011. ORIC's mission is very much aligned with the institute's mission. Its mission is:

“To develop, expand, enhance, and manage the university's research programs and to link research activities directly to the educational, social, and economic priorities of the university and its broader community”.

ORIC has mandate to promote research culture in the institute. It provides support to research activities across all disciplines at the institute. It specifically helps researchers in identifying grant opportunities, writing grant winning proposals, maintaining record of research activities, patent filing, linking academia with industry for commercialization and funding, assisting faculty in negotiating the grant projects with funding agencies and industry, and helping faculty and students in starting new businesses based on their innovations.

Sukkur IBA, through ORIC, is pursuing its faculty members and research students to engage in the applied research to provide the patentable solution of common social problems including education, health, energy, and agriculture.



In energy sector the researchers at Sukkur IBA are engaged in providing solutions of energy problems by working on the projects of enhancing efficiency of alternate energy sources such as solar energy, using wireless energy, and managing the efficient use of available energy source. Recently the scientist at Sukkur IBA has provided the fuel management system involving mobile applications and sensors. The patent of this solution has been filed with IPO Pakistan.

Similarly the scientists at Sukkur IBA are working on the water management system in agriculture fields. They have provided the solution of assessing exact water needs of the land using sensors and controlling the supply of water through mobile application that can work on GSM technology. The patent for this solution has also been filed.

Besides the contribution in technology; the social scientists at Sukkur IBA are also engaged in conducting the applied research studies which are aimed at helping policy makers to introduce the interventions to overcome the social problems. Standardized achievement test (SAT) project helps in informing the policy makers in education to understand the achievement level of students in primary and secondary education. SAT identifies the content strands in every subject where the students are weak. This helps policy makers to design the training programs for head teachers and teachers, improve curriculum, and change recruitment policies. Furthermore, the ongoing study of assessing the efficiency of government examination boards of secondary and higher secondary education is also expected to help policy makers in education to re-think and reengineer the existing examination system.

Moreover, Scientists in social sciences discovering the socio-economic indicators of country's economy an ongoing study on Assessing the Environmental Awareness in Tharparkar Sindh: A survey study on Thar Coal Power Project will provide the economic policy makers a view of people's perception and acceptance to projects that can shape the country's economy.

ORIC Initiatives to Promote Research Culture

With the support of management of Sukkur IBA, several interventions have been introduced to achieve the objectives. Following are some of the important steps.

a. Sukkur IBA Research Policy

Sukkur IBA has developed a comprehensive research policy; and it is being implemented. Consequent upon the implementation of research policy; the number of research publications and grants have increased. This research policy clearly articulates:

- Reduction in teaching load of faculty members engaged in research
- Reward policy for publications in Journal of well repute (ISI indexed, ISI impact factor, and HEC recognized)
- Conference, Workshops, Symposiums and Seminars
- Travel grants policy for researchers to present their empirical research work in national and international conferences, workshops, symposiums and seminars
- Profit sharing policy from the commercial projects/research activities

b. Sukkur IBA Intellectual Property Policy

Considering the importance of innovation in this era of technology Sukkur IBA formulated Intellectual Property Rights Policy (IP Policy) for faculty and students to encourage them in designing and buildings new and innovative ideas, prototypes, and products. Intellectual Property Rights Policy is designed to provide guidelines for ownership, distribution of revenues or royalties, and commercial development of technical innovations, inventions, teaching material and computer software developed by Sukkur IBA faculty, staff, students, and others who use Sukkur IBA as their platform. Policy articulates that ORIC will support and will take the charge of product patenting and commercialization process after the disclosure of the innovation/invention

is made. With the introduction of IP Policy, Sukkur IBA has recently filed a patent and we expect more in near future.

c. Sukkur IBA Research Grant Program

Sukkur IBA firmly believes that research has significance in developing economies like Pakistan. For the enhancement of research culture at institute, ORIC has developed a Research Grant Program for faculty to initiate the research projects. Approved proposals are rewarded monetary support to execute the project. The purpose of Sukkur IBA Research Grant Program is to promote innovation by motivation and encouragement of our natural and social scientists to provide solutions to the problems faced by industry, community, and country at large. A seed grant of 0.5 million rupees is provided to researcher from Sukkur IBA to carry out the research project. Two research projects has been awarded with this seed grant of 0.5 million rupees after the acceptance of their submitted research proposals.

d. Research Capacity Building Workshops Series

After assessing the research strength of our faculty, staff and students engaged in research, Sukkur IBA ORIC initiated Research Capacity Building Workshops Series to build strong research capacity of our researchers. Since 2015, several workshops have been organized from the platform of ORIC on different topics of research development.

e. Monthly Think-Tank Meeting

ORIC provides a platform to faculty and researchers of Sukkur IBA in form of Monthly Think Tank Meeting to discuss new research ideas and innovations. This platform provides opportunity to deliberate upon and initiate interdisciplinary research within the institute. The faculty members are monthly gathered to discuss innovative teaching pedagogies to make learning process more effective. In these meetings faculty members and researchers are rewarded with cash prizes and certificates for their outstanding achievements in teaching

and research. Faculty members candidly provide suggestions for improvements in policies and processes of Sukkur IBA.

f. Sukkur IBA Research School

Office of Research Innovation, Commercialization & Innovation – ORIC is continuously striving to promote research culture at Sukkur IBA and has introduced several initiatives to achieve this objective. In order to further strengthen the research culture, ORIC introduced new initiative named “Sukkur IBA Research School”. The objectives of this initiative are:

- To provide a platform to researchers/scientists of Sukkur IBA to share their research work with peers and get the critical review of their work.
- To help and guide young faculty members to initiate the research in collaboration with senior researchers.
- To provide new research avenues/future research directions to young faculty members of Sukkur IBA
- To facilitate research students and non-PhD faculty members 10 choosing their research topics and supervisors

Sukkur IBA Research Schools opens fortnightly on Thursday from 3:30 PM to 5:30 PM for faculty and research students to present their imperial research ideas and work.

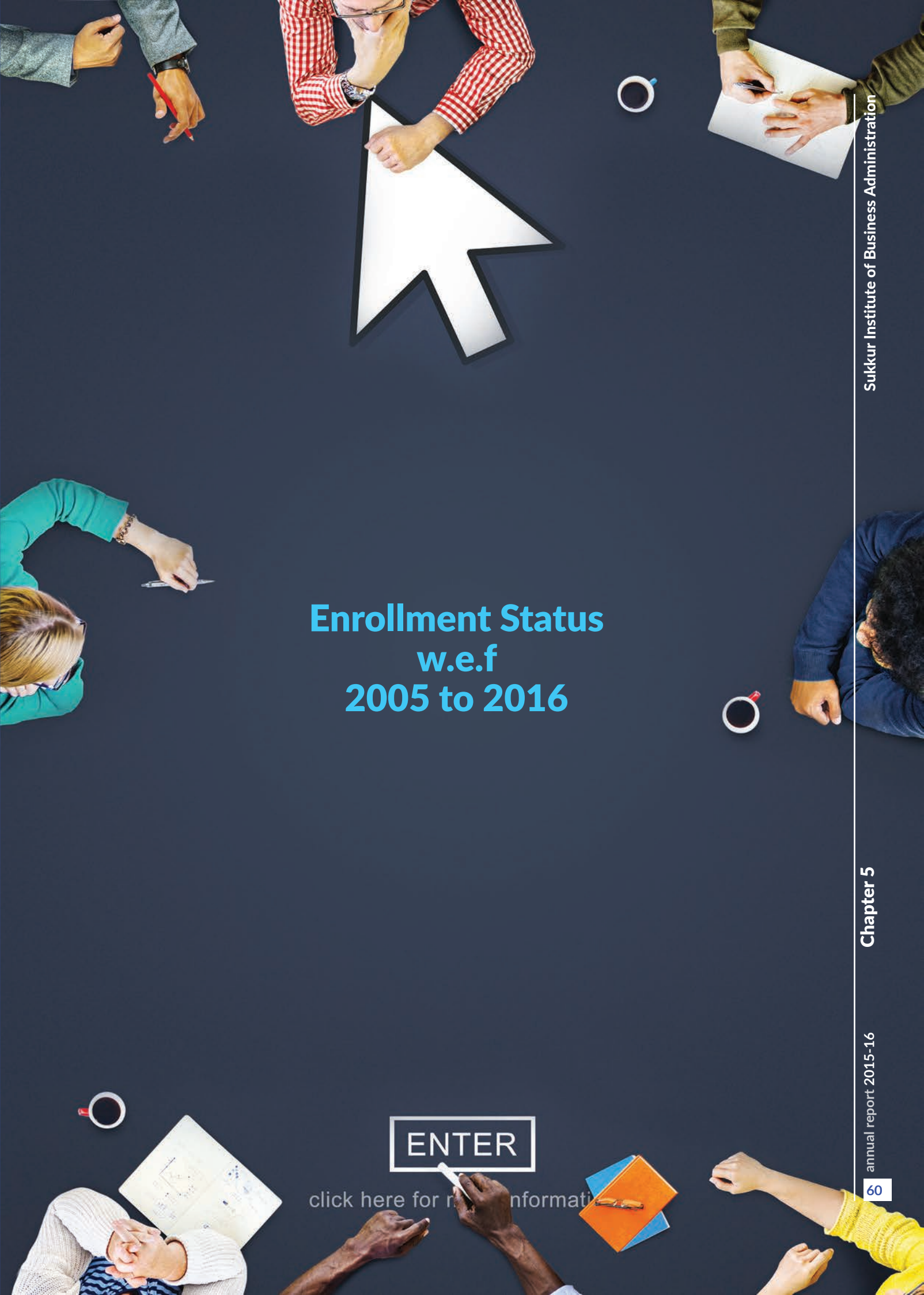

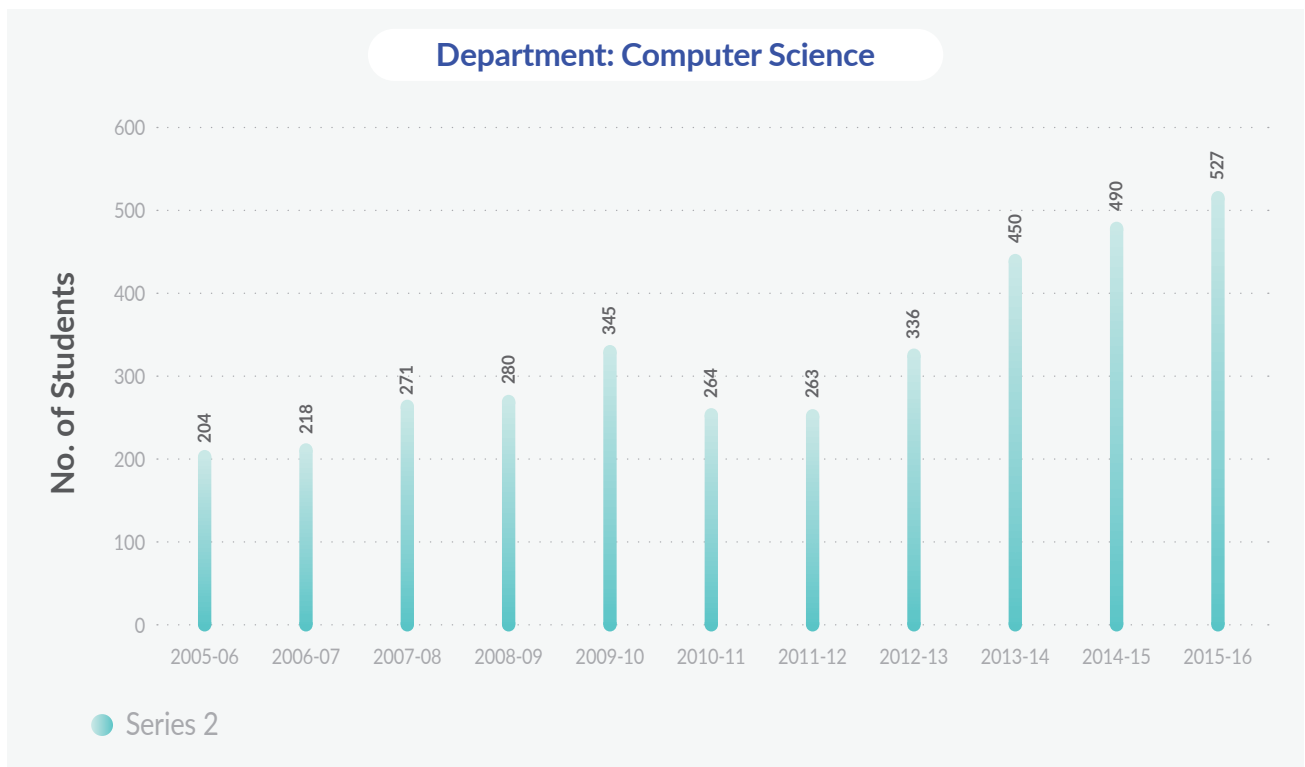

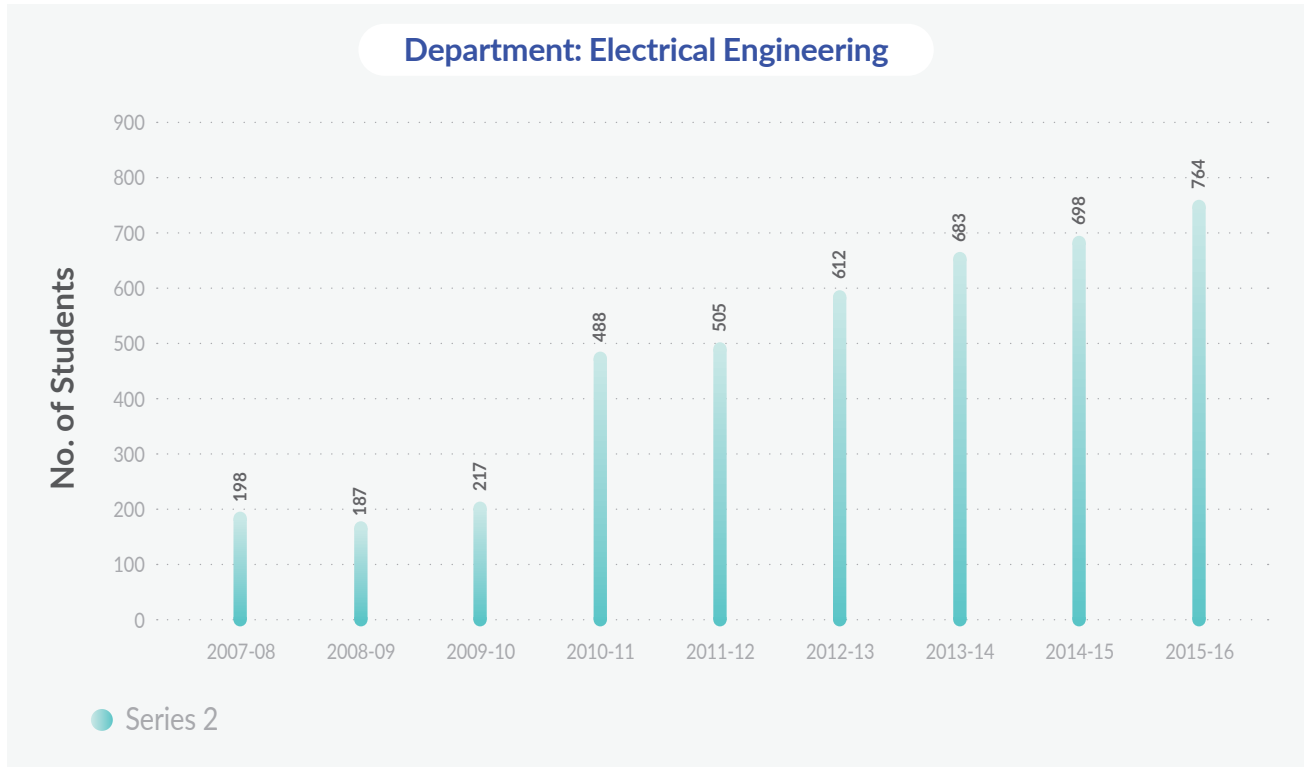
Enrolled Candidates at Sukkur IBA w.e.f 2005 to 2016



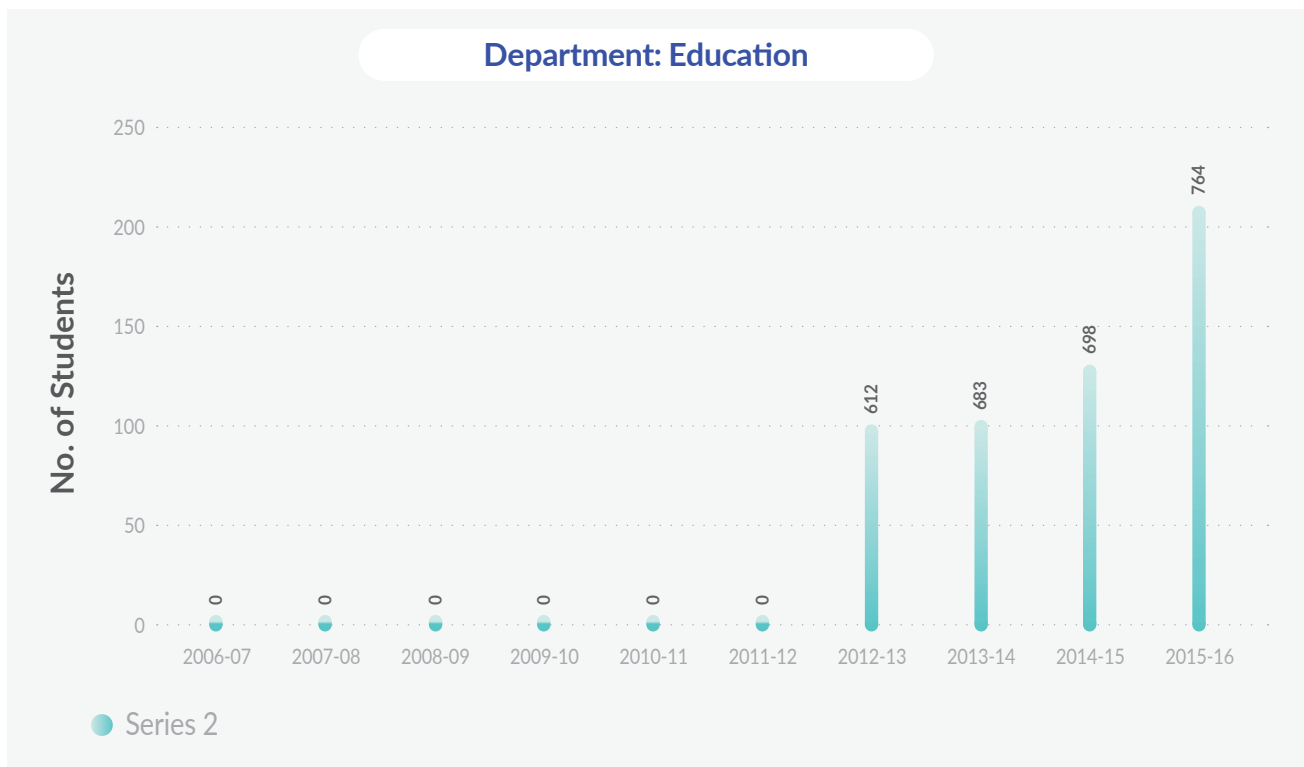
Enrolled Candidates at Sukkur IBA from 2005 to 2016



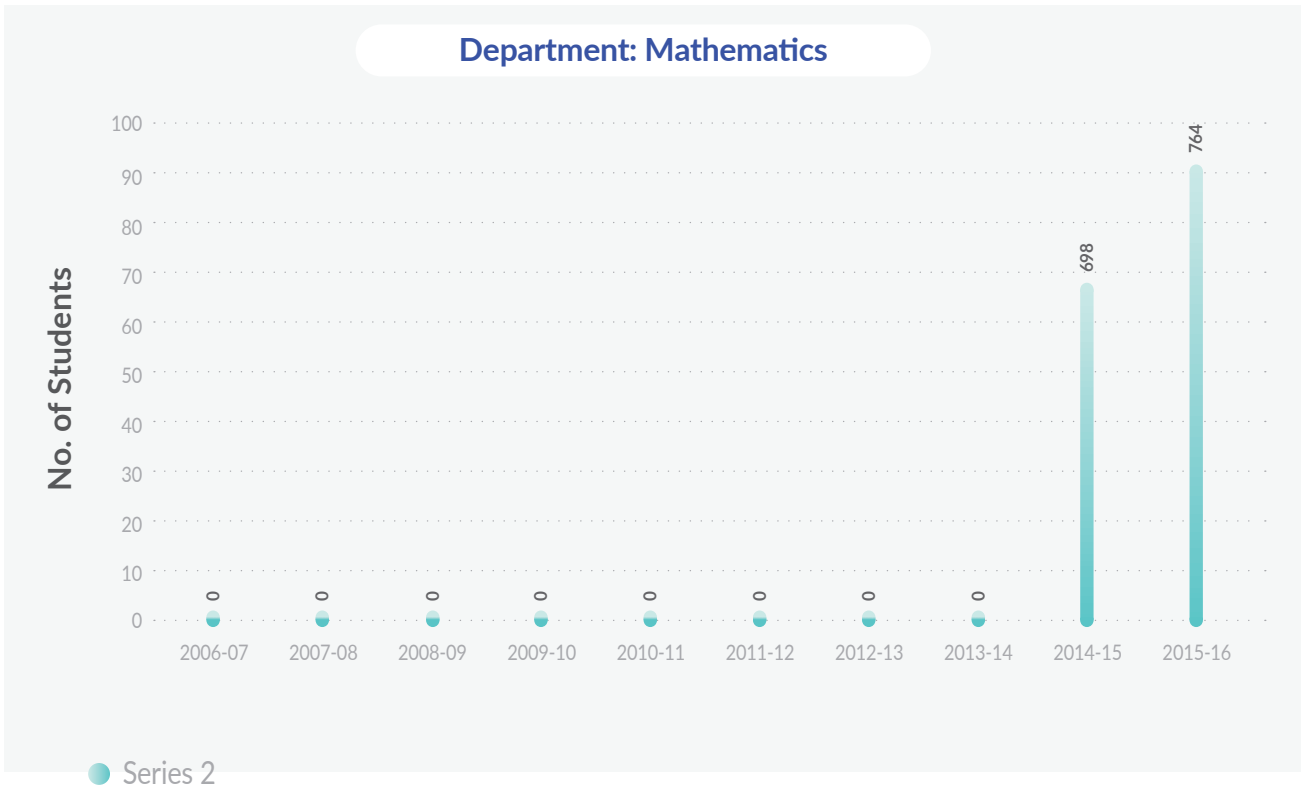
Enrolled Candidates at Sukkur IBA from 2005 to 2016

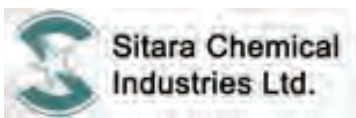

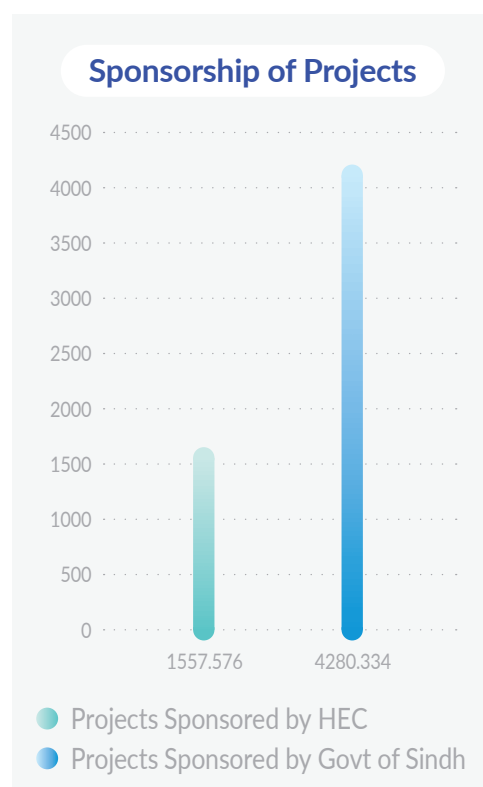

PeopleSoft Human Capital Management (HCM)

Talent Acquisition

The Talent Acquisition enables the electronic handling of recruitment needs, depending on the needs of the institute, generally known as Online Recruitment, by means of online applications.

Performance Management (ePerformance)

Helps the institute achieve its goals through the planning of critical performance targets/Key Performance Indicators (KPIs) and the measurement of progress towards those targets/indicators in HCM.

Core-HR

Automate employee administration, time management, payroll, and legal reporting processes, support compliance with changing global and local HR regulations, Manage Employee Training, update employee and its Job information and Understand, evaluate, and measure workforce's contributions.

Employee Self-Service

This module enables employees to apply for leaves, fill performance appraisal forms by rating themselves on certain KPIs, view pay slips, and update personal information.

Manager Self Service

Enables managers to approve/disapprove leave requests, review, and rate against the rating provided by employee to himself on KPIs in performance appraisal form and update personal information.

PeopleSoft FSCM (Financials & Supply Chain Management)

Accounts Payables

This module provided features like Supplier Management, Voucher/Invoice creation, Budget Checking, Posting Vouchers, Payment Processing, Cash Clearing and Reviewing accounting entries.

Accounts Receivables

Customer Management, Deposit Management, Cash Clearing, and Bank Receipt.

Cash Management

Bank Management, Create Bank Account Transfer and Bank Reconciliation Management is performed in FSCM.

Asset Management

This module covers management of operation in FSCM like Asset Management, Leased Assets, Running Depreciation Process, Revaluation of Assets, Retirement Process, and Creating/Viewing Accounting entries.

General Ledger

Journal Voucher Management, Budget Management, Journal generate process is covered in GL component.

Purchasing

Purchasing module enables the users to create requisitions, Request for Quotes(RFQs), add supplier responses, award quotes, create and dispatch Purchase Orders and add and inspect receipts.

eProcurement

Oracle's PeopleSoft e-Procurement is the self-service requisitioning application that controls employee spending. PeopleSoft e-Procurement allows employees to manage their own requisitions from searching for items and submitting requisitions to tracking statuses and changing requisitions-all while identifying exceptions, enforcing policies, and controlling employee buying.

Inventory

Using this module, users can create, reserve, and deplete Material Stock Requests(MSRs).



Bio-metric Employee Attendance System (TimeTrax)

Biometric attendance devices have been installed at Academic Block 1 and 2, Administration Block, Knowledge Center, and Executive Development Center Building. Attendance Management Software(TimeTrax) that enables employees to record their arrival and departure, providing managers with detailed information about attendance records, absenteeism, overtime etc. The Admin maintain the attendance record and manage the data according to the employees IN and Out. All employees may view their attendance record online.

Virtual University (Video Lectures)

Sukkur IBA has deployed updated release of VU OCW Offline (Free Educational Video Contents/Lectures). These lectures help faculty member and students of Sukkur IBA to learn from renowned professors of relevant disciplines through intra-network facilities at Sukkur IBA.

Learning Management System (Moodle)

Latest version of Moodle, an open source learning management software has been deployed at Sukkur IBA which has been integrated with Turnitin (Plagiarism Checking Software). LMS allows faculty members to create, update and maintain the courses information by uploading assignments, quizzes, creating forums for students, it works as a central repository for complete course contents semester wise which is shared among students.

Virtua Library Management System

Virtua Library Management System is an online public access catalogue (OPAC) to facilitate users for getting firsthand information regarding books physically available at Library. Moreover, users may also view their account status regarding book issued and can also reserve a book. This system has been integrated with Sukkur IBA's SMS Service, users get the SMS alerts upon the issuance or return of the books.

DSPACE A Digital Library

DSpace is a digital library designed by MIT University for E-book Management. About 20,000 E-books are available on Sukkur Digital Library.

Turnitin

Turnitin (Plagiarism Checking Software) has been integrated with Learning Management Software(Moodle) to auto check the plagiarism of submitted content by students at LMS. Turnitin accounts are provided to faculty members to assess the reports submitted by students. Moreover, Faculty member may also get plagiarism report regarding their research drafts. Student work is instantly checked for potential plagiarism using pattern recognition algorithms, Online grading saves instructors time and provides richer feedback with marks directly on student assignments and encourage students to learn from each other and develop critical thinking skills.

3S SYSTEM (Sukkur IBA SMS Service System)

Sukkur IBA has added one more service that is 3S System. Recipients get SMS alerts related to applications mentioned below and apart from that using SMS portal Sukkur IBAians and outsiders also get messages related to jobs, admissions, trainings, workshops, scholarships, tests, and interview announcements.

PeopleSoft CMS (for students and their parents, faculty, staff members)

Students and their parents get absence alerts, attendance warnings, course enrollments alerts, and alerts of posted grades by faculty member. Whereas, faculty members get login in CMS alerts with time and location.

Virtua Library Management System (for students, faculty, and staff members)

Recipients get messages upon the issuance and return of the book to his/her account.

Girls Hostel Check In/Out System (for female students residing in hostels and their parents)

Recipients get alerts when a female student checks out or checks into Sukkur IBA internal Girls Hostel.

PeopleSoft FSCM (for users initiating purchase requests)

Requesters and immediate supervisors receive SMS alerts when the requisition is initiated or approved by the director of the institute.

Faculty Portal

Faculty Portal enables faculty members of Sukkur IBA to update their profile on official website of Sukkur IBA regarding qualification, research, and experience. The faculty portal is integrated to the CMS as well as to the official website. The profile of each faculty member is shown on official website of Sukkur IBA.

Trade Center

Sukkur IBA has established the Trade Centre, in which the students and faculty members are getting live features, updates, and rates from Karachi Stock Exchange. Due to that the students as well as faculty members contribute and view the shares and get the shares and perform business in this regard.

Sukkur IBA Online Testing Service

SOTS application is In-house developed software for HR department. SOTS play the important role in the recruitment of the HR. All applicants may apply for the job position through the PeopleSoft HCM Talent Acquisition module and take the Online Test through SOTS.

Girls Hostel Check-In & Check-Out System

Sukkur IBA has implemented the Girls Hostel check in & check out system, that keeps their parents or guardians informed through SMS alerts, when their ward leaves or enters the campus/hostel. It also keeps the record of all exits and entries of female students from or in the Hostel. This system has been developed to trace the mobility of girls in order to cope with security issues.

There are three types of users of this system.

- 1.Female Hostellers (Initiates the Checkout Request)
- 2.Hostel Administration (Approves or denies the request)
- 3.Security Administration Main Gate (Marks the checks in/out in the system)

Sukkur IBA Alumni Chapter



Situated in a rural setting, Sukkur IBA witnessed the problems of our education system first hand. The difference between incoming students from affluent backgrounds who had studied at quality schools and students from rural areas was not only prominently visible in classroom settings but also in testing environments. The survival of the students from rural schools, when competing with others who had access to all inclusive education, was not only difficult but in most cases impossible. We noted that most students coming in from rural backgrounds could not cope with the standard of education and would generally drop out during the first couple of semesters, Sukkur IBA believed it was our responsibility to our community and a duty to our country to intervene so that all students from all backgrounds could have the same access to quality education.

Keeping equality in mind and quality at the core of our beliefs we decided and needed to intervene. Without properly planned intervention we could not have made a difference. This intervention was planned in two phases, short term intervention in shape of Talent Hunt Program and long term intervention in shape of IBA Community Colleges.



Talent Hunt Program - Short Term Intervention

As a measure of short term intervention that would create an immediate impact, Sukkur IBA planned a unique comprehensive remedial education plan called the "Talent Hunt Program (THP)". The philosophy of the talent hunt program is "access to all"; basically due to poor schooling and education system of the province. The students who seek admission for higher studies in reputed universities of the country face two challenges- first, they are unable to clear the entrance exam of good universities. Second, even if they clear through quick measures and somehow clear the entrance exam, they hardly survive tough grading standards of good universities.

Under the THP, students are admitted after their grade 12 education in a six-month program to be rigorously trained by qualified faculty of Sukkur IBA in core subjects like English,

Mathematics and Computer. Under this program, Sukkur IBA charges no tuition fees from students and provides them with free accommodation, transport, books and additionally an amount of Rs. 18000/- for semester stipend. Any student that is selected in THP and maintains a CGPA of 3.0 under the program would be provided free education, books, and accommodation for the entire duration of the degree program.

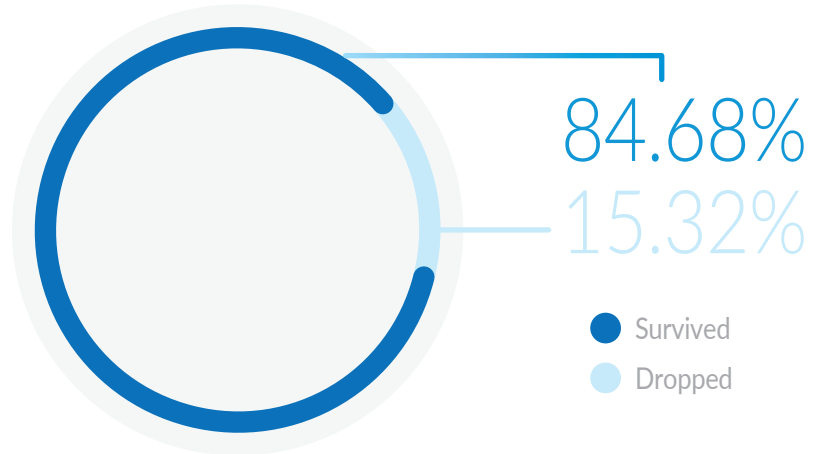
THP was launched in the year 2007 and since then there has been an increasing interest of the community in it. The program has quickly become one of the most popular educational programs in the country and attracted more than 5000 applicants for the 2014-2015 session. Most of these applicants are from underprivileged backgrounds who cannot possibly continue their education if they are

asked to pay for it. Sukkur IBA believes that under the talent hunt program these students would be given remedial education for six months after their intermediate/higher secondary school so that when they enroll into the undergraduate programs they are able to better cope with pressures of a quality education system. The main purpose of this program is to strengthen the base of students in basic courses like, English, mathematics, and computers. In addition, science, social sciences and business subjects are also taught according to the needs of the students.

We can now statistically prove from past experiences that the program has indeed been very effective and has produced the intended results which we desired from this short-term intervention.

Impact of Talent Hunt Program

Before the introduction of THP the dropout rate of students coming from rural areas was 52.74 % which was reduced to 15.32%. The decrease in significant amount of dropout ratio shows the success of Talent hunt Program of Sukkur IBA.



IBA Community Colleges-Long Term Intervention

Although THP is a success story of Sukkur IBA, it is still a reactive approach. We go for remedial actions after the damage has already been done by poor schooling system of the province. Sukkur IBA decided to take a proactive approach i.e. to try to avoid the damage and intervene in the area where this damage takes place.

Being aware of the problem and challenges of the rural education system, Sukkur IBA initiated a long term two-fold intervention plan.

1. Establishing community colleges in various rural districts of Sindh for imparting quality education from Montessori to higher secondary school and associate degrees in various fields. This would create quality students from rural areas who will be better able to compete with students from quality urban educational institutes.
2. The education at community colleges is affordable and access to all is at the core of the program. Sukkur IBA believes that any student who wants to study should not be denied the right to quality education and thus the community colleges are actively working to provide quality as well as equality in education.

Functions of IBA Community Colleges

Basic Education

Although the concept of community colleges in developed countries like the USA and Australia does not include the basic education. Realizing the local needs, this component has been added in concept of IBA community colleges. The idea is to provide the students of Sindh province with quality basic education from KG/Montessori to grade 12. This will ensure that students are no more in need of any remedial education like talent hunt program discussed in previous section. The graduates of IBA community college with grade 12 certificate should be in position to win admission in any reputable university nationally and internationally and will also survive the tough grading standard in higher education.

Expected outcomes of Community Colleges

- To reduce the rural urban divide and enhance the access to quality skill and higher education training.
- To bring the change in the mindset of the people and produce the skilled employable professionals.

- To increase the employment of the youth.
- To contribute to the economic development of country.

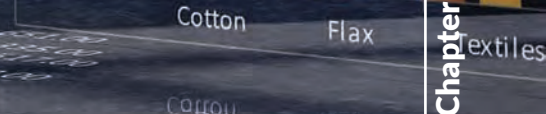

Sukkur IBA since its inception has been striving to eliminate the rural and urban education gap by providing quality education at an affordable cost.

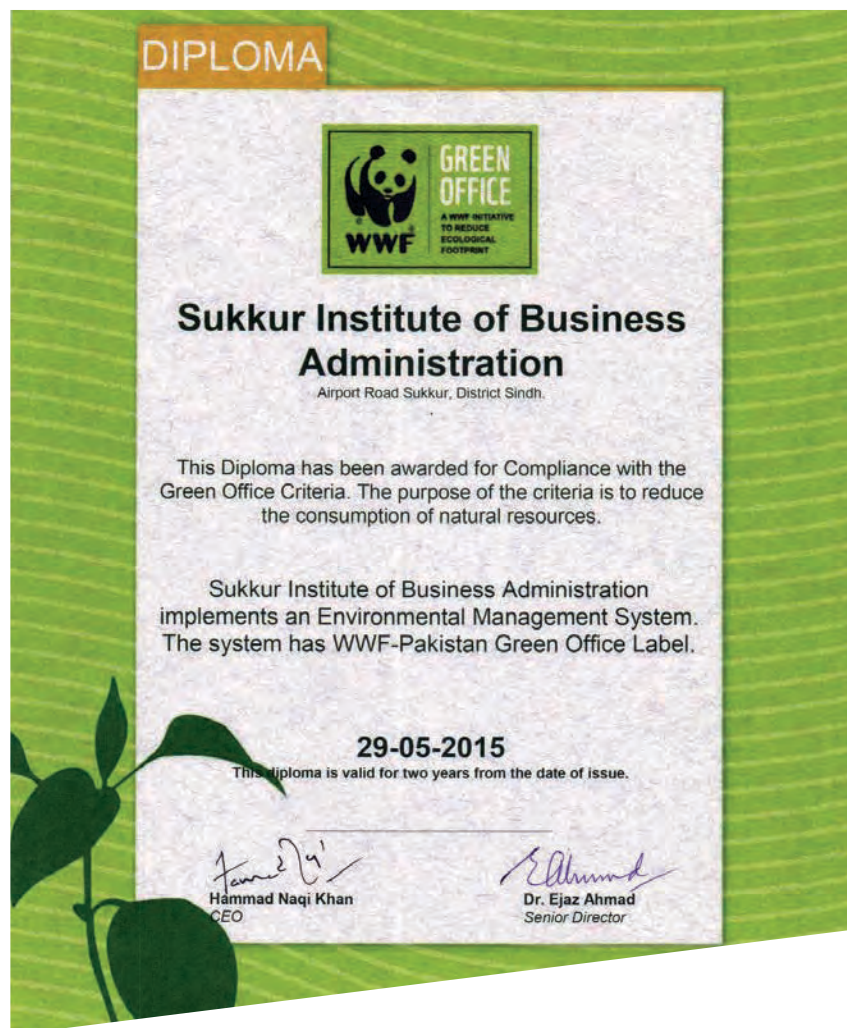

- A. Sukkur IBA Department offices and all Academic Blocks/laboratories should make first aid kits accessible for

- use by the IBA community.
- B. Any manufacturer's kit may be used provided the contents comply with the restrictions.
- C. First Aid Kits are available at all Academic Block, Labs and Laboratories and at all residential facilities, blocks and hostels.
- D. First Aid Kits should be visible or a sign should be displayed indicating its placement location.
- E. Not to dispense or administer any medications, including common pain relievers.
- F. Not to put any ointments or creams on wounds or burns; use ice, cold pack or cold water.
- G. Always call Deputy Registrar to obtain qualified medical



assistance for persons who require medical treatment. If you are trained and provide first aid, direct or transport the injured person to a medical facility for further examination.

H. Wear examination gloves and eye protection when rendering assistance for any situation involving contact with blood or other body fluids.

Establishment of Clinic and Medical Advisory Office

Sukkur IBA has established a free medical care/clinic separately for girls and boys students and staff of Sukkur IBA. The 02 general physicians i.e one for girls and one for boys are appointed for both clinics. The timings for both clinics are from 4:00 pm to 9:00 pm for all the community of Sukkur IBA by providing support in first aid, medical facility and free

medical advisory services.

The university clinic is also providing support to faculty, officers and staff of Sukkur IBA for obtaining free medical fitness certificate and other standard medical tests as prescribed by our general physicians.

women from Thar Pakistan, by helping them in developing cultural products with innovation and selling them in national and international market by using modern social media and websites.



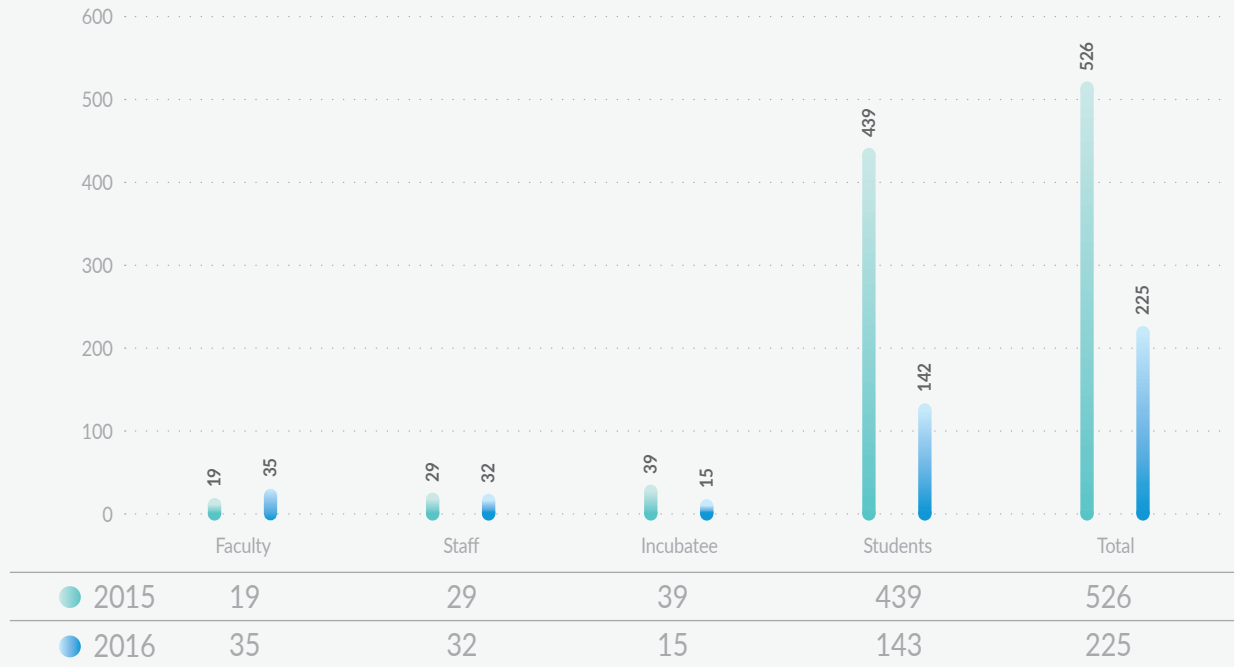
Trainings, seminars, Workshops, Webinars and Online Sessions Organized by CEL&Inc.

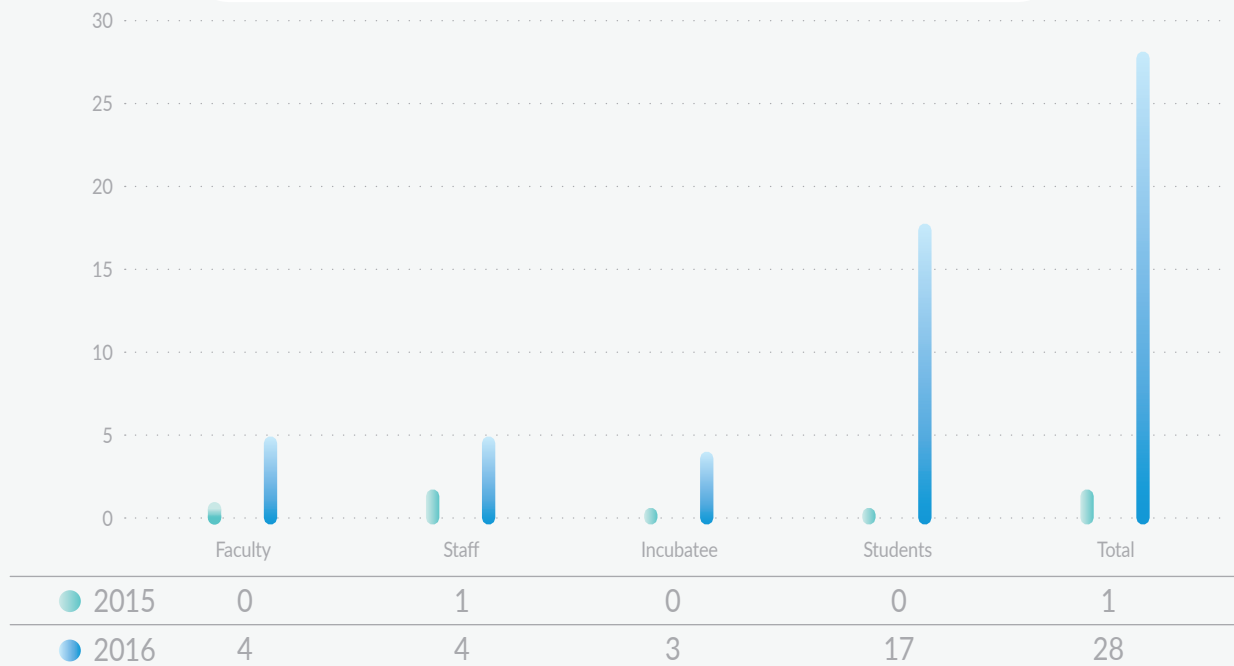


1. CEL&Inc. Recommendation for Entrepreneurship Capacity Building of Faculty, Staff, Incubatee and Students

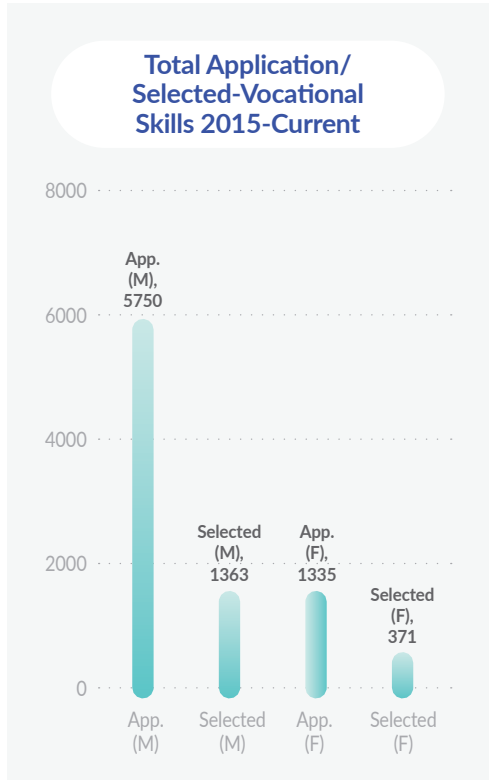

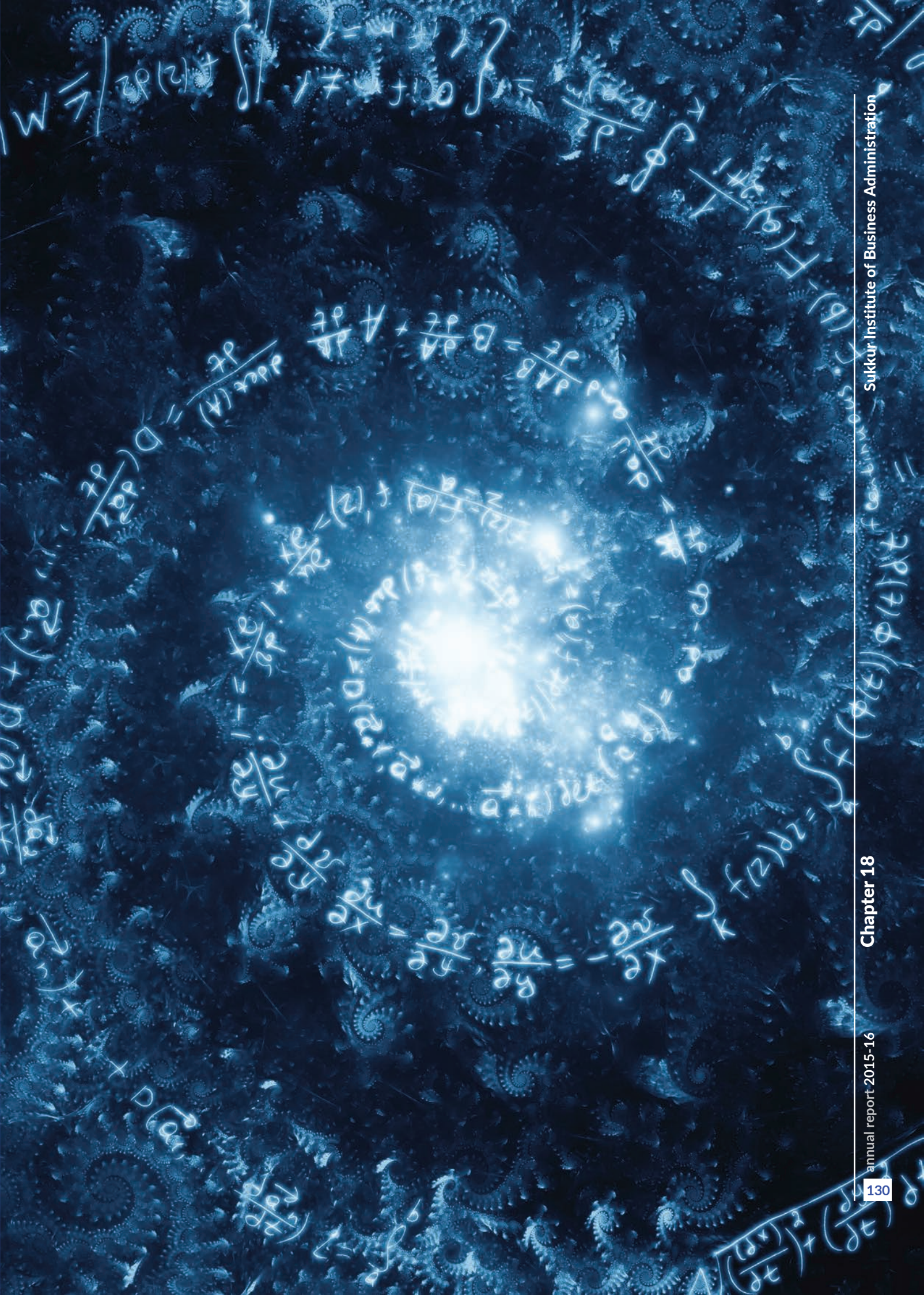

Sukkur IBA library serves as catalyst in supplying resources and services to support the goal of Sukkur institute of business administration. Library assist in the development of information literacy by providing instructions on the use all types of library materials and provide assistance to community beyond the confines of the institute. Literacy possesses a collection around 45,000 print books and more than 100,000 electronic books, accessible via digital library. The library subscribes 30 print journals and provides plenty of electronic journals to its community.

Diverse library services are initiated including circulation services, reference services, literature searching, OPAC, interlibrary loan, multimedia services, photocopy services.

Collection

The university library's collection comprises of more than 45,000 volumes housed in Sukkur IBA library. Holdings are strong in all academic disciplines with notable collection in business administration, computer science, engineering and education. Besides subscription to search journals, library also subscribes to five national and one foreign newspaper, Dawn, The News, Business recorder, Express Tribune.

All library members are entitled to borrow library materials as per their borrowing privileges. State of the art system is being employed for efficient borrowing services. Users can renew and reserve library books online.

Inter-Library Loan

The library is a part of a world-wide consortium that shares materials, allowing member libraries to borrow resources. Through this partnership, the library borrows books from other libraries or has copies of journal articles faxed to them in order to meet students' or faculty members' research needs.

Literature Searching

If library users are unable to search his/her required information material from library electronic collection, library staff facilitate the user in searching required staff.

Multimedia Service

Library has fully equipped multimedia center. The Centre provides viewing of audio visual material on latest viewing devices. It also provides space and computers to access library's digital and online resources.

Table of Content Service

Table of content service aims to provide latest table of contents of subscribed journals to those who have requested to receive the same. TOCs are provided in desired format even soft or hard. Library is a focal point for the use of Turnitin. A software is being utilized to identify similarities between documents and prevent plagiarism. We offer trainings for faculty and students of the university to effectively use Turnitin to desist from plagiarism.

Sukkur IBA Library established four learning & one scholar commons. These common rooms facilitate users

for group discussions. Students and researchers can avail this facility during library opening hours.

Citation Management Services

Library subscribes to and has also identified free citation management software. We offer hands-on trainings to enable faculty and researchers to use them effectively in their research work.

Wi-Fi Connectivity

Library is a hot-spot. Users can access internet on their laptops and other mobile gadgets in the library.

Library Website

Library maintains a dedicated website which is gateway to library resources, systems and services. Users can not only access library resources and services through the website but also contact library staff for replies to their library related queries. Library.iba-suk.edu.pk



General Rules

- All members shall be required to leave their personal belongings (books, files, briefcases, handbags, registers, etc.) at the entrance of library. Library disclaims any responsibility for any loss.
- Users are not allowed to write, underline or mark the library books. The library books are carefully examined on return and the borrower shall held responsible for defacing or damaging or causing loss of library material in their possession.
- In case of study in the library, after consultation the library material are to be left on the reading table, which shall be shelved by library staff appropriately.
- Complete silence shall be observed inside the library, except for brief subdued talk with the library staff at the circulation desk or any other section of library. However, non-noisy discussion are allowed in designated learning commons.
- Drinking (except water) and eating shall not be allowed inside the library.
- Using of mobile phones and smoking are strictly prohibited inside the library.
- Loud talk/ un-necessary

discussion/ disturbance/ snoozing etc., shall not be allowed inside the library.

- Non-issuing textbooks will be issued for a shorter period of time.
- Library card is must for access to library premises and to check out any library item.
- Make sure you have provided correct email address while filling your library membership form as whole correspondence including overdue notices will be communicated through email.
- Loan may be renewed though library circulation desk or online portal if another user has not reserved the desired book. Overdue books will not be renewed online.
- Books already checked out by some other user can be reserved. You can also request reserving the book through library portal.
- If you accidentally misplace a book and could not find it after a thorough search, report to the circulation desk.

Fines

To encourage timely return of library materials and to provide optimal sharing of the collections, fines are charged for overdue items. Borrowers are responsible for returning or renewing items by the due date.

- If items are not returned within due date, fines become retroactive to the first overdue day at Rs. 10/- per book per day.
- Lost books: In case of loss or damage, the patron will have to replace the lost item with original or new edition or he will be charged two times according to the current price of the item.
- Non-circulating text books: This material is issued for three hours only. If item is not returned within the allocated time, a fine of Rs. 50/- for each hour will be charged.
- Disciplinary Fines: Rs. 500/- on first time violation. If the patron continues the violation, the case will be referred to disciplinary committee.
- Overdue and fine notices will be sent through official email. All library fines are only paid through bank challan. Library account will be blocked if the fine exceeds Rs. 5,000/-
- While returning library books or other materials at the circulation desk, please ensure that the circulation staff has returned the item from your account.
- Do not give your library card or checked out materials to others. This may be helpful to avoid hefty overdue fines, especially in case of course reserves.

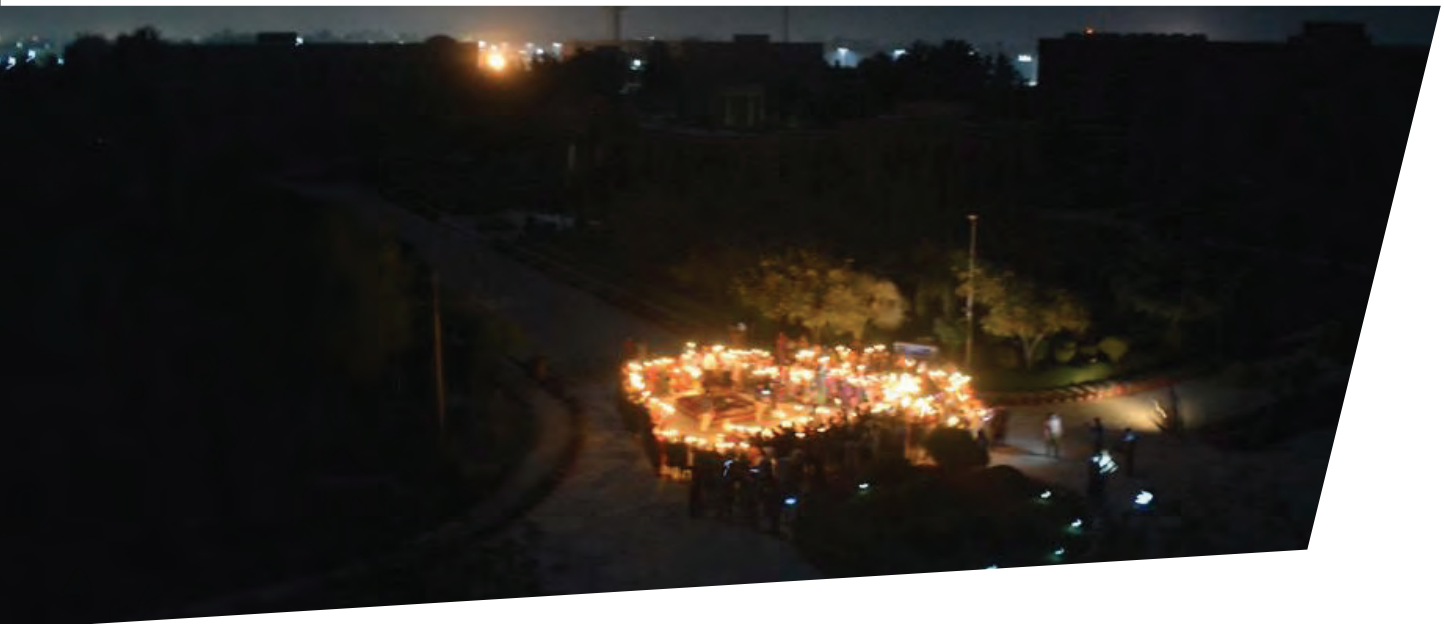

Environmental Sustainable Initiatives

- Solar Energy System

For energy conservation and saving natural resources, Solar Energy System has been installed at Sukkur IBA. The specification of this system covers the supply of photo voltaic solar system that is operated in conjunction with a D.C generating set (the association solar invertors) to provide necessary AC power supplies to Sukkur IBA.

Further "installation of Solar Energy System and LED lights at Sukkur IBA" is under process. This project will produce 600 KW of electricity through solar energy system.

- ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning):

ERP (Enterprise Resource Planning) is designed to implement paperless environmental practices at Sukkur IBA. The term refers to the system of integrated applications, which are used to operate the automations and processes of the organization.

HCM (Human Capital Management System) automates the operations related to HR. It provides the self service options for all the employees where employees can perform various online actions like applying for leave, fill the form of performance appraisal, view pay slips, and maintain personal information, qualification and experience.

FSCM (Financials and Supply Chain Management) automates the operations related to finance and procurement department. Apart from departmental specific operation, it also provides self-service for all the employees where users can generate online inventory and purchase requisitions.

- LMS (Learning Management System):

LMS (Learning Management System) is implemented for online academic activities. This system is designed to promote paperless environment. A learning management system (LMS) is a software application or Web-based technology used to plan, implement, and assess a specific learning process. Typically, a learning management system facilitates instructors in creating and delivering content, monitoring student participation, and assessing student performance.





- CMS (Campus Management System):

Campus Management System is designed to implement paperless environmental practices at Sukkur IBA Campus. It is unique and comprehensive software. CMS at Sukkur IBA acts as a bridge of communication between students, faculty and management of the institute. It hosts the features that allow users to maintain academic history of students with complete transparency in records and provide a medium for teachers, staff and administration to work in harmony.

- Green Marketing:

Green Marketing approach is implemented for promoting sustainable environment through various promotional activities at Sukkur IBA.

- Green HR:

Green HR approach is implemented to promote paperless environment at Sukkur IBA. Online recruitment process has been initiated. In this connection online forms are available at the official website of Sukkur IBA for applicants and online recruitment test is conducted for various positions.

Environmental Impact of Green Office Initiative: Reducing carbon Emission

1. Insulation of Walls (with jambolan sheets)

Sukkur IBA is located in very hot region, where temperature remains above 50 Centigrade for eight months in a year, so the buildings are designed providing enhanced circulation area, double leaf cavity wall system (outer double walls having cavity in between) in the building infrastructure, that cavity is filled with jambolan sheets in order to reduce the heat impact inside the building. Jambolan sheets (Polystyrene product) are 8ft by 4ft in size and 2 inch thick.

2. Insulation of Roofs (With Insulation Tiles)
(CCTile + LightWeight Cellular Concrete +Thermo Pore)

Matrix Company in association with Concrete Measures has developed new lightweight insulation roof tile made from a combination of thermo pore and cellular concrete also known as aerated concrete.

Composite roof insulation tiles provide following benefits:

1. Excellent finish in variety of cement color finish and terrazzo finish
2. Double insulation of cellular concrete and thermo pore.
3. Lightweight
4. Absorption less than 2 %
5. Concrete compressive strength, approximately 3500 psi.
6. Micro reinforcement with high strength synthetic fiber.

Details of Roof Tiles are as follows:

1. Tiles Size: 300 * 300* 500 mm, 200*200*50 mm.
2. Cellular Concrete Density: 1500 kg/m³ , approximately
3. Thermo pore Density: 16 kg/m³ approximately
4. Thermo pore Thickness: 25 mm approximately

Reducing Wastage:

We have placed recycle and non-recycles bins for supporting the environment, and encourage the use of reusable cups in the offices instead the disposable cups.
